Since 1990, the population of the Nordic countries has grown by 15 percent up to 26.5 million people, mainly due to immigration from abroad. Still many Nordic municipalities struggle with declining and ageing populations, and labour shortages. In this webinar Leneisja Jungssberg and Hjördis Rut Sigurjonsdottir, researchers at Nordregio, will discuss the role of migrants in rural and remote areas and the local practices in the regions which have included immigration as part of their development strategy.
